New Nursing Home in Bukit Purmei

Singapore Anglican Community Services (SACS) has been awarded a Ministry of Health tender for a nursing home in Bukit Purmei. This is part of SACS's and its sister organisation, St. Andrew's Mission Hospital's (SAMH) collective efforts to support Singapore's ageing population and meet the increasing need for senior care facilities.

The new nursing home to be located next to Radin Mas Primary School will have about 270 beds spread over nine floors. Construction will begin in 2025 and is expected to complete in 2027. Services are slated to commence within the same year of the building completion. The nursing home will cater to residents with dementia, disabilities and others.

SAMH will also be opening two new nursing homes in Aljunied and Tampines North in 2024.

Dr Arthur Chern, Group Chief Executive Officer of SAMH and SACS said,

"Combining all our eight nursing homes, we will be serving the community with a total capacity of about 2,500 beds by 2027."

"Uplifted Spirits"

Medical Services

Mdm Ng Quee Kiow, 92, was diagnosed with advanced chronic kidney disease in 2022.

She was referred to St. Andrew's Community Hospital (SACH) Violet Programme for patients who require home palliative care to manage her care holistically at this stage of her illness.

Mdm Ng always looks forward to the uplifting home visits by the warm and friendly care team. With the care and support provided by the Home Care Team, Mdm Ng's medical care, previously performed by polyclinics and the hospital, is brought to her directly in her home, with round-the-clock coverage.

"A Lasting Legacy of Love"

Senior Services

Mdm Herminie Liang, 79, fondly remembers her hospitalisation stay a St. Andrew's Orthopaedic Hospital (SAOH) when she was 10 years old. Mdm Liang suffered from polio since her childhood and recuperated in SAOH for two years after an operation. The love and care from the SAOH team remains etched in Mdm Liang's heart.

In early 2022, Mdm Liang had a fall and lost her ability to walk. When she was advised to be admitted to a nursing home, Mdm Liang only had St. Andrew's Nursing Home (SANH) in mind. She is now happily settled down in SANH (Henderson). Together with her new friends, she actively participates in activities such as art and craft sessions and outings to places of interest and around the neighbourhood.

"A Circle of Support"

Psychiatric Services

Mdm Zarinah led an isolated life after her marriage broke down. Soon after in 2015, she was diagnosed with schizophrenia. The ailment subsequently brought Mdm Zarinah to the Day Rehabilitation Centre at Anglican Care Centre (Yishun). Here, she received counselling and learnt to manage her anxieties. By challenging herself to participate in social and recreation activities, she gradually gained confidence.

Today, as a peer leader at the centre, Mdm Zarinah - affectionately known as 'Rina' to members - plan members' activities alongside fellow peer leaders. She also guides them through culinary and handicraft activities. Outside the centre, she has learnt to better manage household chores as well as picked up new skills like using social media and playing online games.

Family and Children Services

Over the past 6 months, CREST Youth SACS has engaged more than 500 individuals through various roadshows, talks and workshops related to aspects of mental health and wellness. The team has had the opportunity to reach out to youths. caregivers, educators and healthcare professionals through their outreach efforts.

CREST Youth is part of Singapore Anglican Community Services (SACS), notable for its body of work in adult psychiatric care. CREST Youth focuses on serving young people aged 13 to 25 residing within the Northeast region of Ang Mo Kio, Serangoon, Hougang, Sengkang and Punggol.

Through education and early intervention, CREST Youth hopes to breakdown stigmas and misperceptions associated with mental conditions. By advocating positive role modelling, self-care and help available during these engagement sessions, CREST Youth can work directly with the young person or through schools/youth organisations to strengthen community partnerships and support for those who may be or are experiencing mental duress.

Educators and youth workers who worked with CREST Youth reflected how the outreach programmes also bring to light the struggles of their students and young wards.
